First Cut	Final Cut
Audio Natural room ambience as recorded on location. Some of the takes have pauses or stutters.	Most background noise is eliminated, and only selected ones remain. Theme music, sound effects, voices of other characters. Better takes were selected with smoother dialogue.
<u>Video</u> Picture is raw and blurry.	Picture is crisp and clear. Color grading has been done to increase overall vibrance.
Action Follows the script exactly.	Action is embellished to make it visually more interesting, e.g. shots of the room that tells the story of the restaurant, interaction between the staff and customers.
Length Too long for a 60 second spot.	Video is within 60 second requirement.
Pay Off (message and attribution) Does not contain an end message or call to action.	Contain a call to action and end credit.
